

**Art and D&T:**

Make authentically decorated jewellery inspired by ancient Egyptian jewellery.

**Geography:**

Identify and locate the country of Egypt. Locate major cities and areas of historical importance. Study modern Egypt and its culture, industry, language and traditions.

**History:**

Look at the ancient Egyptian timeline. Explore Egyptian gods, pharaohs, mummification and hieroglyphics. Understand how and why the pyramids were built.

**Numeracy:**

Securing methods for adding and subtracting decimals numbers. Investigating properties of shapes. Securing methods for Multiplying and division including decimal numbers in the context of money. Investigating measurements involving volume and capacity. Multiplying proper fractions and mixed numbers. Finding percentages of numbers and linking to fractions and decimals.
