

English

- Narrative writing - using the story of the Wolves in the Walls by Neil Gaiman as our class text. We will read and explore the story and the features it continues. We will be using sentence stacking to develop our understanding and practise a variety of technical and grammatical features, such as dialogue, repetition, rhetorical questions and the power of three. This unit will end with children creating their own version of this narrative, applying the skills that they have learnt.

History (long unit)

Vikings - who they were, where they came from, why they were successful, ways of life, transport (long ships) and trade

Art and D&T

Creating Viking longboats.
Drawing and painting pictures of the local area in transition period.

Working in groups to compose a piece of music to accompany the story of Beowulf.

SPAG

- Revision of Year 3/4 spelling list words and Year 3 grammar objectives

Maths

Multiplication & Division - consolidating knowledge of multiplication division facts within the multiplication tables. Introducing formal methods of division (bus stop).

Fractions - revisiting and consolidating knowledge of fractions and applying their understanding in more complex problem-solving contexts.

Geometry - using precise vocabulary to explain the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. Exploring measuring and calculating the perimeter of shapes.

Science

- Plants (continued) - labelling plant parts, studying what plants need to grow, planting and investigating; and studying the life cycle of plants
