

Science (Long Unit)

- Living Things and their Habitats (*Year 2 unit*) - explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive
- Children will make observations of a local habitat and the creatures that live there, investigating conditions in local microhabitats and how they affect the minibeasts found within them
- This unit allows children to research a range of global habitats and how the living things that live there are suited to their environments
