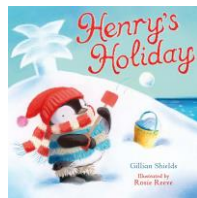

Enhancements to continuous provision

Staff will create more detailed short-term plans based on the children's needs, interests and fascinations

Consolidation of RWI Set 1 sounds. Some children may begin to learn Set 2 sounds. Daily phonics lesson and 'pinny time' throughout the day.

Some children will continue learning to blend. Most children will begin to read Ditties and Red books.

Some children may progress to Green books. Using Fred Talk to read words and simple sentences.
