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Pupil Voice

Evidence in Skills

Pupils can use their acquired knowledge to compose, play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts. They can use the vocabulary they have learnt to appreciate and understand a wide range of music.

Breadth and Depth

Teachers plan a range of opportunities for children to use musical skills on their own and in groups. Pupils have the confidence to perform their own musical compositions and to give their opinions on a wide range of music.
