### **Pupil Voice**

Through discussion and feedback, children talk enthusiastically about both learning in lessons and other learning experiences to do with SMSC (e.g. themed days). Children across the school can speak confidently about the benefits of learning about themselves, others and the world around them.

Pupils know how and why it is important to learn about ourselves, others and the world around us. They can talk factually about their bodies, how they change and how to stay safe and well.
